James River Crossing -before and after the flood



The <u>September issue</u> of Texas Highways Magazine ran an article about Islands in Texas that features the island at James River Crossing, just below the confluence of the Llano River and the James River. The article featured a drone image of the island before the flood (left). The photo on the right shows island after the October flood. Note the much wider river following the flood. For reference, note the location of the tree at the bottom of the island (see arrow).

Also, a word of caution to paddlers: The entrance to the north channel above the bridge has shifted slightly and there now two trees partially blocking the channel (see top of right photo).


Floods on the Llano in the 20th Century

Last October, the <u>Austin Statesman</u> <u>featured a history of floods</u> on the Llano River during the 20th century. The article, based on Jonathan Burnett's book <u>"Flash Floods in Texas"</u>, chronicles five major floods that hit the Llano River: 1932, 1935, 1936, 1952, and 1978. Oddly, the 1997 flood, was omitted from the article. The online version of the
